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Introduction

Vivekananda Polyclinic & Institute of Medical Sciences (VPIMS), Lucknow is run by Ramakrishna Mission, Belur Math, District Howrah (West Bengal). It is a well established 360 bed, multispeciality premier hospital providing health care to the public of Uttar Pradesh and neighbouring areas. It has earned good reputation both in public and medical fraternity. A nonprofit organization having well experienced and well trained staff. The hospital is committed to provide most modern state of art of medical care in a cost effective manner. To fulfil its commitments the hospital has added several new facilities which will go a long way in meeting out the aspirations of common people. These facilities include a modern operation theatre complex, post operative wards, critical care areas, dialysis unit and various other specialities. The clinical facilities are backed by latest diagnostic aids. viz. Spiral CT, 2D Echo, TMT, Lung function Test and Allergy Tests besides ultra-modern pathological, microbiological and biochemical laboratories. Apart from general medical care, specialized care is provided by various super specialties. The hospital has a Licensed Blood Bank which is capable of supplying blood components.

The super specialties in medical disciplines at VPIMS, Lucknow include Neuro-Medicine, Gastro-Medicine, Cardiology, Pulmonary Medicine, Rheumatology, Immunology, Haematology, Nephrology, Endocrinology and Medical Oncology; while in Surgical disciplines, they are Neuro surgery, Urology, Laparoscopic surgery, Plastic surgery and Joint replacement surgery. The interventional dermatology treatment is a new addition. Eye surgeons routinely perform IOL, Phacoemulsification and squint surgeries. This hospital has been recognized by 'Smile Train' (a nonprofit U.S. based organization) for free repair of cleft lip and palate.

The hospital is equipped with a canteen catering to the needs of the patients, their attendants and hospital staff. A Dietician is present in the canteen so that the patients may get the food as recommended by various consultants. There is also an in house Central Pharmacy which provides hospital approved medicines round the clock. A well furnished Raina Basera (rest house) is available for indoor patients' attendants. The Medical library is well equipped with up-to-date books and journals, with internet access, teleconferencing, Xerox facility, overhead projector and multimedia facilities.

VPIMS, Lucknow is accredited by National Board of Examinations, New Delhi of the Govt. of India to conduct DNB courses in 12 subjects (Family Medicine, General Medicine, General Surgery, Orthopaedics, Ophthalmology, Neurosurgery, Plastic Surgery, Pathology, Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Radiology, Paediatrics, Anaesthesia). Besides, the Institute has a College of Nursing affiliated to CSMMU, Lucknow to impart B.Sc. Nursing (4 yrs. course), a school of Nursing to train for Diploma in Nursing (recognized by State Medical Faculty) and Paramedical courses for Laboratory, X-Ray and Operation theatre technicians (recognized by Indian Medical Association, New Delhi). This hospital has also been recognised as a centre for practical training for MHA students of Lucknow University.

Vivekananda Polyclinic Infrastructure :

ICU

Vivekananda Polyclinic has a 12 bedded Intensive Care Unit with modern state-of-art facilities. There are three ventilators and one transport ventilator, along with other equipments viz. Capnograph, Defibrillator, External Pacemaker and facility to monitor Arterial Blood Gases. The unit is equipped with central monitoring facility, motorised beds, water beds, air beds, portable X-Ray machine and air purifier. There is provision for placement of central vascular access for monitoring of various parameters and total parental nutrition. It has backup laboratory, radiological and imaging facilities. Intensivists and dedicated nurses look after critically ill patients round the clock. Other specialists are available on call. The ICU caters to the need of patients with acute asthma, liver and kidney failure, myocardial infraction, myoneural and endocrinal diseases. The health care providers, who work in ICU, are carefully chosen. They are required to serve with dedication, compassion, and vigilance. Most of the patients who are admitted in intensive care unit have compromised immune system. Meticulous care is taken to prevent cross infection. Scrubbing of floors, carbolization, barrier nursing and bacterial filters in various apparatuses are provided to curtail infection.

NICU

A special section of critical care area is dedicated for infants and neonates. There are 12 beds with baby warmer, incubators, phototherapy units, monitors, ventilators, and infusion pumps. Critically ill newborns who are suffering from oxygen lack/lack of blood supply to the brain, neonatal jaundice, infections, or low birth weight are successfully treated in the NICU.

PICU

There is also a separate section of critical care area having six beds dedicated to acutely sick children.

Operation Theatre Complex

The operation theatre complex of Vivekananda Polyclinic has six main OTs, one maximum containment OT, and one Ophthalmic OT. Apart from these, there is one minor OT and one emergency OT. The main OT complex is provided with adequate space for preanaesthesia patient's hold up, post anaesthesia cases and relations waiting area. Each theatre has advance version of Boyles Apparatus, vital function monitors and tiltable operation tables. In addition C-arm Image intensifier, laparoscopic sets, TURP, PCNL, lithotripsy, Renal Ureteroscopy and Hysteroscopy equipments, and operating microscope are also provided. An average of 700 to 750 major and minor, routine or emergency surgeries in all age-groups are carried out every month. All types of general surgeries, and the surgeries related to Orthopedics, Trauma, Joint Replacement, ENT, Eye, Gynaecology, Urology, and Laparoscopy are done at VPIMS.

One high dependency operation theatre has been specially equipped for Neurosurgical operations and joint replacements.

A pain clinic on out-patient basis is also conducted adjacent to the operation theatre complex. It is supervised by highly skilled anaesthesiologists.

Dialysis Unit

The Dialysis Unit of Vivekananda Polyclinic & Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow is equipped with twelve state-of-art Haemodialysis machines supplied by M/s B. Braun Company (Dialogue). The unit also has facilities of cardiac monitor, defibrillator and sophisticated water treatment plant (Reverse osmosis). There is a special operation theatre for procedures. This unit has a provision for undertaking home dialysis (continuous peritoneal dialysis) for ambulatory patients. Very critically ill patients can be put on dialysis in the wards or in ICU unit without shifting them to the dialysis unit. The Unit is headed by competent nephrologists and trained paramedical staff.

Cardiology

An ultramodern State-of-art Cardiac Catheterization (Lab) with 12 bedded cardiac care unit (CCU) is functioning round the clock. A Cardiac Ambulance equipped with monitors, Oxygen, Cardiac resuscitation drugs and defibrillator is also available 24 x 7 hours. Angioplasty and Pace maker implantation is routinely carried out by the Cardiac unit. A Cardiac Tele medicine facility has been established with Indraprastha Apollo Hospital, New Delhi.

Neurosurgery

Team consists of three highly skilled Neurosurgeons who operate daily in two state of art operation theatres which are equipped with microscope, C-Arm, Endoscopes etc. With the collaboration of Plastic surgery department it undertakes Facio - Maxillary surgery and repair of congenital and acquired defects. Thirty two bedded Neurosurgery ward is equipped with monitors and Ventilators. About 80 to 100 cases are usually operated per month.

Holistic Medicine

Apart from modern medicine, the VPIMS also offers services of alternative medicine such as Naturopathy, Homoeopathy, Ayurvedic and Pranic Healing according to the faith and choice of patients.

Mobile Camps

A well-equipped medical van regularly visits specified villages at the outskirts of Lucknow for benefit of villagers at Katra Bakkas, Pahar Nagar, Ataria and Ram Van Kutir. They are situated within a radius of 50 Kms in Lucknow, Sitapur and Barabanki districts. The Rural Health Programme is augmented with Telelink under guidance of IIT, Kanpur.

Concluding Remarks

True to the ideals of Ramakrishna Mission of serving God in the suffering humanity, Vivekananda Polyclinic & Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow has kept its doors wide open for the common people, for providing best Medical care possible at most affordable cost.

Goals of the DNB Programme

1. To impart Post-graduate Medical Education & Training in broad specialities & super specialities of Medicine and Surgery which are accredited by the NBE.
2. To provide Residency type of training i.e. direct participation in Medical care of patients under supervision & guidance of consultants, both for out patients & indoor patients admitted in the hospital including those in Emergency, ICU and periphery.
3. To train competent & humanitarian Medical specialists in chosen areas of specialization - with capability of providing quality medical care to various medical problems in their speciality independently & scientifically.
4. Besides acquiring knowledge, skills & aptitude in their field, the specialists are expected to have learnt integrity, developed human values of ethics, compassion, discipline of mind, spirit of service and devotion to duty.
5. To develop skills of communication required for patient care, advocacy and Medical Education at different levels.
6. To make capable and habitual of self-learning and enquiring mind to remain abreast with all future developments in the respective subjects.

General Instructions to the Candidates

1. Diplomate

Diplomate of National Board (DNB) is a Postgraduate Medical Examination conducted by the National Board of Examinations (NBE), New Delhi on all India basis. DNB is recognized at par with M.D., M.S., MCh and D.M. degrees and is included in the First Schedule of Medical Council of India (MCI). The teaching experience of DNB qualified candidates is deemed to be equal to one year's experience as Tutor/Registrar/Demonstrator or equivalent post in a recognized Medical College imparting undergraduate teaching and training for appointment as Lecturer.

2. Registration

All candidates (3 years training after passing Primary/CET examination and 2 years training after passing Postgraduate Diploma courses) are required to register with the NBE within one month from the date of joining VPIMS, Lucknow. In Family Medicine, candidates can register without passing Primary/CET examination of the Board or Diploma in the subject.

For Super specialities NBE offers two type of courses -

- a. MBBS with CET/Primary passed - 6 yrs. course
- b. MS or MD with Super speciality-CET - 3 yrs. course

Vivekananda Polyclinic and Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow is presently accredited to impart training and teaching in the following subjects:-

August Batch: Surgery, Family Medicine

January Batch:

- a. Medicine, Paediatrics, Anaesthesiology, Orthopedics,
Ophthalmology, Obsts & Gynaec., Radio-diagnosis, Pathology
- b. Neurosurgery and Plastic surgery (Super-specialities).

3. Eligibility

- a. Age preferably under 30 yrs. at the time of admission.
- b. Medical qualification registrable under Medical Council of India Act 1956. They should have completed one year compulsory internship.
- c. The candidates for Broad Specialities (except Family Medicine) are required to pass Primary (CET) examination of NBE before being considered for training at VPIMS. The CET result is valid for two (2) calendar years. The course will be of 2 years for holders of Post graduate Diploma in the speciality. The later do not require to pass Primary/CET for eligibility.
- d. For Super speciality-
 - With MS or MD degree, for three years course, after clearing Super-speciality CET, result of which is valid for two (2) calendar years.
 - For candidates who have passed MBBS with Primary (CET) examination are eligible for six years' course.
- e. No credit for House Job done prior to admission will be given. All candidates will have to undergo full training at VPIMS, Lucknow as required by NBE course guidelines.

4. Hospital Duty Hours

All DNB students will have to report at 8:00 a.m. and will have to be in the hospital till 8:00 p.m. or when the hospital work is over, whichever is later. They must ensure that the Wards are attended throughout 24 hours by rotation. When they leave their duty station, their whereabouts should be known to the responsible person at the duty station. Approximately the distribution of duty hours will be as follows –

- 8 hours Clinical/Hospital work.
- 4 hours Academic/Library/work, etc.

However, the patients shall always have priority.

All DNB courses are full time Resident training courses. No private practice or any other job is allowed.

5. **Stipend/Remuneration**

Each DNB student will get a monthly stipend as per the following details:-

6. **Library Facilities**

Every DNB student should spend at least 25 hours per month in the library. Standard Text Books (latest edition) of Medical subjects are available in the library. Apart from reserved books, the books can be loaned to the students for a period of 15 days. They can be reissued. A late fee of Rs. 1 (Rupee one only) per day will be levied. Any damage to the books will be charged from the borrower. No journals will be issued on loan. The library also has Internet (Broad Band) Connection, Photocopy Machine, Overhead Projector and multimedia facilities to help the students. Both Indian and International Journals are available in the Library.

The library of VPIMS is equipped to receive IGNOU sponsored teaching programmes via satellite and watching of these programmes is required by the NBE. The students shall also consult NBE teaching and training material on DVDs for clinical skills. The library is open on all days except on National holidays for 10 hours each day (11 a.m. to 9 p.m.). In addition, libraries at CSMMU and SGPGI may also be consulted as guest member.

7. **Training Charges**

A sum of Rs. 50000/- will be charged annually from the candidates who opt for campus (hospital) accommodation, while those who do not live in the campus will be charged Rs. 40,000.00 annually.

All fees should be paid either in Cash or by Demand Draft drawn on any Nationalized Bank in favour of 'Ramakrishna Mission Sevashram' payable at Lucknow.

8. **Staff**

Well trained and experienced staff is available at VPIMS, Lucknow to teach, train and guide the students.

9. **Extracurricular Activities**

VPIMS aims at grooming students into a well-developed, all-round personality. The students will be encouraged to acquire proficiency in public speaking, debates, dramatics and computers. Arts, sports and cultural programmes are also offered.

10. **Dress**

Modesty in dress is expected strictly with no extremes in style and makeup. Wearing jewellery while on duty is not permissible. Wearing a white coat on duty is essential.

11. **Gifts**

Students must not accept or receive any gift or money from the patients or their relatives and also from the staff.

12. Admission Procedure

The admissions will be made twice a year in August and in January as detailed above under point 2. There will be an advertisement in National Newspapers of English edition and the selection will be made after an interview. Candidates who are Diploma-holders and opt for Family Medicine will have to appear in a written test prior to interview. The selected candidates will have to undergo medical examination on payment of Rs. 250/- (Rupees Two hundred and fifty only). After medical examination, they will have to deposit the applicable training charges amounting to Rs. 50,000/- (Rupees Fifty thousand only) either in Cash or by a Bank Draft in favour of 'Ramakrishna Mission Sevashram' payable at Lucknow. They shall have to submit all the documents in duplicate. The supportive documents should be attested by a Gazetted Officer. The admitted candidates will have to give an undertaking that they will not leave the course prematurely failing which they will have to pay damages as per terms of undertaking.

13. Duration of Courses

- Broad Specialities after MBBS : 3 Years
- Broad Specialities after P.G. Diploma : 2 Years
- Super-speciality with MBBS only : 6 Years
- Super-speciality with MD/MS : 3 Years

14. Training and Posting Roster

The training programme in each discipline will be drawn by the HOD/DNB coordinator of the subject concerned in consultation with Medical Education Cell, keeping in mind the guidelines of NBE particularly in relation to exposure to different areas of training. The goal would be to make training meaningful as much as possible. The monthly hospital posting shall be drawn by the Medical Superintendent in consultation with respective HODs and DNB Coordinators. This shall accommodate the requirement of NBE guidelines regarding exposure in the allied specialities/different consultants of the same speciality.

15. Leave Rules

Candidates will get upto 20 days casual leave and 5 days conference leave per year. Any extra leave will be treated as leave without pay. Lady students will get a 90 days maternity leave with stipend once only during the whole period of training. However, this will not be counted towards the extension of training period. In addition only 15 days of preparatory leave before theory examination and one week before the practical examination will be allowed. Very frequent or prolonged leaves may necessitate disciplinary action including extension of DNB training period.

16. Attendance

At least 85% attendance should be there before they are sent up for examination by DNB.

17. Accommodation

A shared accommodation in the campus may be allotted to the candidates. During final year, these students will be given single rooms as far as possible. The charges for the accommodation will be Rs. 10,000.00 per year or part of the year.

18. Medical Facilities

The candidates will be eligible for medical facilities on Out-Patient basis. However, for Inpatients, they may get some concession on the discretion of the Secretary, Ramakrishna Mission Sevashram, Lucknow.

19. Thesis

The candidates must submit their thesis protocols within three months of admission and full thesis should be sent six months prior to their final examination for approval of N.B.E., New Delhi. Guidelines for writing thesis can be seen at N.B.E. Web Site www.natboard.nic.in. The thesis proposals will require clearance from Hospital Ethics and Research Committees.

20. Office Hours

The Medical Education Cell will generally remain open on week days from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. and will remain closed on Sundays and declared holidays.

21. Discipline for Students

Every student shall conduct himself/herself in accordance with the ethics of the hospital. He/she should sincerely believe in the Basic Principles of the Institution, i.e. care and service of humanity (without any distinction of religion, race, colour, caste, or creed) with complete dedication, love and as much renunciation and sacrifice as possible considering this as worship of God and also to strive for advancement of spiritual and ethical aspects of personality.

22. Code of Conduct

Every student: -

- Shall abide by and obediently maintain and help maintain decorum in the Polyclinic as well as outside.
- Shall be strictly punctual in studies, recreation and work; and further shall pass his/her life in a moral way both in the Polyclinic and outside.
- Shall pursue his/her theoretical and practical studies faithfully and obediently with interest and diligence, both in the classroom and the Polyclinic.
- Shall abstain from deleterious, mischievous and unlawful activities.
- Shall not take himself/herself or administer to anyone else any harmful drug.
- Shall learn and acquire bedside manners of high standards and shall never lose temper and shall do everything in his/her power to observe, follow and maintain the ethics and standards of the profession.
- Shall keep secret and confidential all personal matters or affairs of patients and his/her family matters which may be confided to him/her or may come to knowledge in, or in connection with the work.
- Shall loyally render all possible help and assistance to the consultant in his work.
- Shall honour faithfully and shall try to acquire the aims and objectives of the Polyclinic.
- Shall learn to be courteous to the patients and their visitors; they are also to be respectful and obedient to their superiors.
- Shall not organise unauthorised meetings or assemblies within the premises or undertake collection of union subscription. Collection of any money for any purpose cannot be done without prior permission in writing from the Authority.
- Shall refrain from unruly behaviour, defiance or disobedience of lawful instructions/orders of the superiors. Such behaviour will expose a student for disciplinary action which may include removal from the institution. Decision of the Disciplinary/Appellate Authority will be final and binding in all cases.
- Shall refrain from damaging hospital or Sevashram properties. Also avoid misuse of water and electricity facilities causing wasteful expenditure. In the event of any breach or damage thereof, the cost will be recovered from the salary/stipend of the student.
- Breach of any of the foregoing shall attract disciplinary action.
- Withdrawal: It is expected that once a student is admitted, he/she will continue in the training until completion of the course. In case a guardian finds it necessary to withdraw his/her ward, he/she will inform the Authority in writing stating the reason for his/her decision to withdraw the ward. The application will be duly considered and necessary action taken by the Secretary of Ramakrishna Mission Sevashram. Before releasing of a student from training in such a case, the guardian/student will have to clear the dues and pay the damages as per undertaking. The Secretary Ramakrishna Mission Sevashram, Lucknow shall be the competent and final authority to take decision in such cases.

- Every student, while in the hospital or outside, shall be bound to obey the orders of the Authority or any higher/superior of the Institution e.g. the Medical Superintendent, Consultant or the Secretary, the Head of Departments/Doctors and the Medical Education Cell under whom he/she may have been deputed to learn the practical side of the work.
- Any negligence in, or disobedience of any of the matters enumerated in above paragraph or subparagraphs concerned shall render the student liable to disciplinary action and for termination of training.

Disciplinary Action

All matters requiring disciplinary action (apart from petty incidents disposable by superiors with routine warning - oral or written) against a student shall be reported in writing by the person aggrieved or by the superior or any other official concerned: -

- If the offence is committed in the institution, then to the Head of the Department under whom the student may have been deputed to work or learn; the Head of Department will then, in writing, call for written explanation in respect of the offence, and the student shall submit his/her written explanation immediately.
- If the written explanation offered by the student does not satisfy the Head of Department as sufficient or if the offender fails to submit the written explanation, the Head of Department shall forward the papers, if any, with report to the Officer I/C Medical Education Cell, who may forward the matter to the Medical Superintendent with his comments.

The Medical Superintendent shall consider the matter and shall close the matter if he is satisfied with the explanation submitted by the student. However, if the Medical Superintendent is not convinced/satisfied with the explanation submitted by the student, he will frame the charges and serve charge sheet to the student. The Medical Superintendent will appoint an Inquiry Officer to inquire into the charges levelled against the student. The student shall be asked by the Medical Superintendent to face the inquiry before the Inquiry Officer and submit his/her defence, if any. The charge sheeted student can be allowed by the Medical Superintendent to take the assistance of a co-student to defend his case if he so desires.

After the completion of the enquiry, the Inquiry Officer shall submit his report to the Medical Superintendent, who may agree or disagree with the findings of the Inquiry Officer and shall pass order of punishment or acquittal to the student based on facts, circumstances, gravity of charges and findings of Inquiry Officer. The Medical Superintendent shall be the Disciplinary Authority in case of DNB students.

Appeal

Aggrieved with the decision of the Disciplinary Authority, the concerned DNB student may appeal to the Secretary of Ramakrishna Mission Sevashram, Lucknow within 7 days of receipt of order of Disciplinary Authority. The Secretary of Ramakrishna Mission Sevashram, Lucknow, who is the Appellate and final Authority in the matter shall decide the case looking into the facts, circumstances and gravity of the charges proved against the student.

Jurisdiction of Court

All disputes are subject to the jurisdiction of Lucknow courts only.

General

All or any of the powers, duties, or functions of the Secretary, Ramakrishna Mission Sevashram, Lucknow in respect of the above paragraph may be delegated by the Secretary to his nominated panel by a general or special order as may be deemed fit or convenient by him. The Secretary may also assign any of the powers, duties, or functions of any of the Officers or functionaries in the above paragraphs, or to any other officer or functionary, from time to time, as he deems fit in the interest of administration, in his judgment.

The rules set forth as above are subject to amendment from time to time if deemed necessary by the Management.

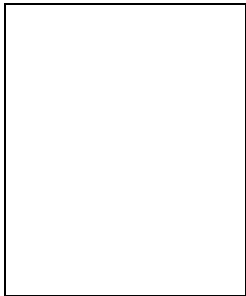
Cost of Prospectus

1. **Application of candidates producing false or fabricated documents or records will NOT be considered and will be further debarred from future admission.**
2. **Admission would be cancelled if faults are deducted later.**
3. **In case of Medical Graduates from outside India, proof of clearing exam conducted by NBE or equivalent.**
