27th Annual Continued Medical Education (CME)

Vivekananda Polyclinic & Institute of Medical Sciences (VPIMS), Lucknow celebrated its 27th Annual Continued Medical Education (CME) on 16th February, 2015. The programme started with lighting of lamp amidst Vedic invocation by the monks of Ramakrishna Mission Sevashrama, Lucknow. **Swami Muktinathananda, the Head of the Institute** welcomed the audience and said

that the theme for this year is **Pain Management**. He emphasized that the physician in order to be successful in pain management should share and feel the depth of the pain of the ailing patient and this endeavour should not only be academic but also emotional and spiritual.

The **Chief Guest, Dr. A.K. Agarwal, Professor, Deptt. of Anesthesia, SGPPI, Lucknow and Past President, Indian Society for Study of Pain**, said that in pain management the patient seeks empathy from the treating physician and not sympathy. Four eminent Physicians during their presentations highlighted different aspects of pain management. **Dr. Rakhi Gupta, Consultant Intensivist & Pain Specialist, VPIMS, Lucknow** gave a detailed presentation on ‘**Introduction to Intervention Pain Management**’ and said that the Pain services are classified as acute or chronic and they could be provided as OPD, IPD or community based service depending on the need and

convenience of the patient. **Dr. Sanjay Dhiraj, Addl. Prof. Deptt. of Anesthesia, SGPPI, Lucknow** discussed various ‘**Modalities available in management of Cancer Pain**’ and said that the patient who are given Psychological, Social and Spiritual support during the treatment respond better. Elaborating further he said that Multi- Nodal Anesthesia and Interventional Technique to help in reducing the burden of distressing symptoms and morphine still remain the main stay of the treatment

Dr. Sujit Gautam, Asst. Prof. Deptt. of Anesthesia, SGPPI, Lucknow gave a detailed pretention regarding ‘**Approach to a case of low back ache**’ and said that all conditions which pose a threat to life should be excluded prior to management of the case. He said the main stay of conservative management is to educate the patient to remain active and administer heat application, exercises and pain killers. He also said that bed rest, traction and lumbar support are not useful. **Dr. Shweta Agarwal, Consultant Rheumatologist, VPIMS, Lucknow** said that history taking of the patient is very important in ‘**Approach to a case of Rheumatologist Disorders**’. She said that in Rheumatoid Arthritis the duration of the symptoms, number and type of joints involved and deformity, if any, are of great help in the diagnosis and further management of the case.

Each presentation by the speakers was followed by lively discussion and questions from the learned audience comprising of more than 100 distinguished doctors & Post Graduate Students.

LAMP LIGHTING CEREMONY

The Lamp Lighting Ceremony of the **10th batch of B.Sc., Nursing and 24th batch of GNM Nursing students** of Vivekananda College & School of Nursing was celebrated on **17th February, 2015** at VPIMS, Lucknow in the presence of a large number of distinguished people of the city including the parents of the students.

Prof. J.V. Singh, Dean, Faculty of Nursing, King Georges' Medical University, Lucknow was the **Chief Guest** during the function. Medical Camps

• **Diabetes Acupuncture Camps:** A monthly Diabetes Acupuncture clinic under the guidance of **Dr. Jay Kumar Dixit, President, National Acupuncture Organization of India** was arranged on **5th February & 5th March, 2015**. A total of 47 diabetic patients were seen during the camp.

• **Homoeopathic Camp:** **Dr. Ashok Kumar Pradhan**, a renowned Homoeopath from **Institute of HYDT (Homoeopathy, Yoga & Diet Therapy), Kolkata** conducted a two days' camp on **14th & 15th February, 2015** at VPIMS, Lucknow. **64 patients** suffering from chronic ailments were seen during the camp.

• **Ayurvedic Camps:** A 12-days' long Ayurveda Panchakarma camp was organized at VPIMS, Lucknow from 09th February to 20th February, 2015 on Joint & Spine diseases, Obesity, Skin diseases and Sexual problems. 144 patients were given OPD consultation and 27 cases were registered for Panchakarma camp.

• **Free Cardiology Camps:** Three cardiology camps were organized in the months of February & March, 2015 at Barabanki, Basti & Dudhi where a total of 248 patients were provided free consultation as well as free investigation including ECG, Blood Sugar as well as Echo cardiogram, as per requirements, out of which 03 patients were shortlisted for surgical intervention which were to be performed in VPIMS either free or at highly subsidized cost by a team of competent surgeons.

Installation of Oxygen Generator System-AIRSEP (U.S.A.)

Oxygen Generator System-AIRSEP (U.S.A.) supplied by M/s AIROX Technologies Pvt. Ltd. was installed in the hospital adjacent to the erstwhile Gas Plant on 5th March, 2015. The equipment Airsep (USA) Imported Oxygen Concentrator Model AS-L has a generating capacity of Oxygen at the rate of 34.17 cubic meter/hour, comprising of absorber tower, microprocessor panel and FEED AIR PACKAGE 37K.W. Screw air compressor, air receiver 2000 L, refrigerated air dryer, filters, oxygen receiver 2000 L capacity, oxygen analyzer auto switch over system & Stabilizer for Generator. The oxygen generator system has been functioning smoothly and has largely reduced our dependency on portable oxygen cylinders to meet day to day requirement of the hospital.



Commissioning of Modular Operation Theatre

Super Speciality Operation Theatre (O.T. No.2 & 4) at VPIMS, Lucknow were renovated and two pre-fabricated Modular Operation Theatres have been commissioned on 9th February & 3rd March, 2015 respectively.

The modular operation theatre has a wall and ceiling panel made of stainless steel sheet (1.6 mm), besides Plan Air Ceiling System with unidirectional airflow, Hepa Filters, Electronic Operated Hermetically sealed Sliding Doors, Membrane type operation theatre control panel and a Single Pendant (with facility of fixing own Anesthesia Moveable) besides Air Handling Unit (AHU) System with condensing unit along with electrical control panel. Seamless conductive tiles for the flooring system Medical Gas Pipe Line System, Ducting, Hatch Box (for disposal of dirty linen) and LED lights for the ceiling have been also provided in the Modular O.T. Floors.



Donation of Medical Equipment

Powerlinks Transmission Limited (A Joint Venture of Tata Power & Power Grid) donated the following equipments to VPIMS, Lucknow under their CSR initiatives to the philanthropic hospitals:

- **Ultra Sound Voluson P8 Machine** with facilities for 3D & 4D imaging.

The machine has one Convex probe for abdomen scanning, an Endocavitary probe for Endo-vaginal and Endo-rectum scanning, a Linear probe for soft issue, musculo skeletal and breast imaging. There is, in addition, a Cardiac probe for Cardiac imaging and Doppler study.

3D & 4 D probe is of great use for detection of congenital anomalies in the foetus at an early stage.

- **Ultra Deep Freezer Machine:** An Ultra Deep Freezer Machine manufactured by IiShin Biobase Co. Ltd. with a capacity of 730 liters was donated to the Blood Bank of the Institute. It has a dual refrigeration system for fast temperature pull down and can maintain a temperature of -80^oC. It can store 800 plasma unites.

Both the Machines were inaugurated by **Swami Nikhileshananda, Ramakrishna Mission Home of Service, Varanasi** in the presence of **Swami Muktinathananda**, Monastic Brothers, Senior Administrative Officers and Consultants, Technicians (X-ray and Blood Bank), and Mr. Srivastava and other representatives from Tata Power Co. Ltd. on 28th March, 2015.



Thereafter, **Swami Nikhileshananda** was taken to the renovated Ayurvedic Department and was briefed by Dr. Vijay Seth on the Panchkarma Treatment and other facilities available for treatment of patients.

Village Health Programme

The Village Health Programme team of VPIMS comprising General Physician, Ophthalmologist, Gynaecologist, Paediatrician, Dental Surgeon, Ayurvedacharya, DNB trainees and paramedical staff with equipment and medicines continued their programmed visits to **KATRA BAKKAS** in Lucknow District on Mondays, **HEERPUR ATARIA** in Sitapur District on Wednesdays and Saturdays, **RAMVANKUTIR** in Barabanki District on Thursdays and **MAHMOODABAD** in Sitapur District on Fridays. The following number of patients were treated during the last two months:
